Landed Learning Indigenous Education Program Developer

Job Description

The Landed Learning Indigenous Education Programmer will advance Indigenous perspectives in land-based elementary education with the Intergenerational Landed Learning Project at the UBC Farm on the traditional, unceded territory of the $x^wm \partial k^w \partial y \partial m$ (Musqueam) people. The role will support three main program objectives: 1) To honor Indigenous culture and lands through enhancement of Landed Learning programming, 2) To support, liaise with, and learn from existing Indigenous programs at the UBC Farm, including the Culturally Relevant Urban Wellness (CRUW) youth program, and 3) To develop a new Indigenous-focused school year Farm program for elementary children from the Aboriginal Focus School (AFS).

The student must be able to commit to being available Wednesday and/or Thursday mornings, May-June 15, 2017, and alternating Saturdays throughout the term. There may be opportunities to continue through the 2017-2018 school year.

The student responsibilities include:

Communications and Consultation

- Develop and implement an assessment of the needs and expectations of the AFS community (intermediate students, parents, and teachers)
- · Help plan and attend an Elders council meeting
- Liaise with staff from Indigenous programs at the UBC Farm to develop protocol for sharing of resources, curriculum, spaces
- Recruit Indigenous mentors who can offer children Indigenous perspectives through school year program
- Liaise with cultural knowledge keepers to schedule cultural workshops for school year program

Curriculum Development & Youth Program Facilitation

- Create a proposal for implementing the recommendations of stakeholders (AFS community and Elders) for a AFS school year program
- Develop programming recommendations and collaborate with Landed Learning staff to pilot recommendations to advance Indigenous perspectives through:
 - o practicing Indigenous protocol
 - o raising awareness of colonial assumptions
 - o highlighting Indigenous perspectives within existing programming
 - o engaging children in an Indigenous-focused workshop
- Develop an Indigenous Perspectives pro-D workshop for teachers and program staff
- Support staff, youth, and volunteers during Landed Learning school year visits and CRUW Saturday programming. Pilot workshops

- Attend regular staff meetings and liaise between the Landed Learning and Indigenous Farm programs
- Develop a materials list and budget for school year program
